WHY NDPR COMPLIANCE IS NON-NEGOTIABLE

Legal Mandate

The NDPR is a legal requirement for all entities processing personal data of Nigerian citizens. Non-compliance is not an option.

Mandatory Audits

Organizations processing data of 1,000+ subjects in 6 months or 2,000+ in 12 months must file annual Data Protection Audits with NDPC.

Consequences of Non-Compliance

Significant fines (up to 2% of annual gross revenue or \\$10 million), reputational damage, and loss of customer trust.

Transition to NDPA reinforces the need for robust data governance

Step 1: Map Your Data - Controller vs. Processor

Data Controller

Determines the purpose and means of processing personal data. Makes decisions about what data to collect and how to use it.

Decides data collection purposes

Obtains explicit user consent

Bears primary liability for compliance

Responsible for data security



Data Processor

Processes personal data on behalf of the Controller.

Acts according to the Controller's instructions and requirements.

Processes data per Controller's instructions

Implements security measures

Reports to the Controller

Shares liability for breaches

Clearly define your role and map all data flows (collection, storage, processing, sharing) to understand your obligations.

STEP 2: CLOSE THE GAPS

Mitigate Identified Compliance Issues



Lawful Basis

Ensure all data collection has a lawful foundation

- Obtain explicit consent from data subjects
- Document legitimate business interests
- Maintain consent records



Data Minimization

Collect only necessary data for stated purposes

- Review data collection practices
- Eliminate unnecessary fields
- Set data retention limits



Security Measures

Implement technical and organizational safeguards

- Deploy data encryption protocols
- Establish access controls
- Regular security audits



Data Subject Rights

Establish procedures for handling data requests

- Access request procedures
- Rectification mechanisms
- Erasure and portability processes

APPOINT YOUR CHAMPION: ESTABLISH A DATA PROTECTION OFFICER (DPO)

MANDATORY REQUIREMENT


The DPO is a mandatory requirement for many organizations under NDPR/NDPA. This individual or entity serves as the organizational champion for data protection compliance.



Serve as the liaison between the organization, the NDPC, and data subjects on all data

ACT AS CONTACT POINT

protection matters.



Offer advice on data protection matters and

ensure employees understand their obligations

PROVIDE EXPERT GUIDANCE

under data protection laws.

STEP 4: DOCUMENT & REPORT - PREPARE THE ANNUAL AUDIT

Failure to submit results in significant penalties and regulatory action.

MANDATORY SUBMISSION

All organizations must submit annual Data Protection Audits to the Nigeria Data Protection Commission (NDPC) through a licensed Data Protection Compliance Organisation (DPCO).

YOUR AUDIT MUST INCLUDE:

1

Data Processing Activities

Detailed description of all data processing activities, including types of data collected, stated purpose, and parties with whom data is shared.

2

Policies & Procedures

Comprehensive documentation of all data protection policies, procedures, and organizational measures implemented to safeguard personal data.

3

Proof of Compliance

Evidence demonstrating compliance with NDPR requirements, including consent records, Data Protection Impact Assessment (DPIA) results, and audit documentation.

4

Risk Assessment Results

Outcomes of internal risk assessments, compliance reviews, and audits conducted to identify and mitigate data protection vulnerabilities.

Step 5

CULTIVATE A CULTURE - EXPLICITLY TRAIN ALL STAFF

The human factor is critical. Employees are the first line of defense and the most common source of data breaches.

TRAINING FOCUS AREAS

- Awareness: The importance of NDPR and its impact on their daily roles and responsibilities.
- Procedures: Handling personal data, recognizing and reporting data breaches, and responding to data subject requests.
- Accountability: Understanding their role in protecting organizational data and maintaining compliance standards.

Regular, mandatory training for all new and existing employees
